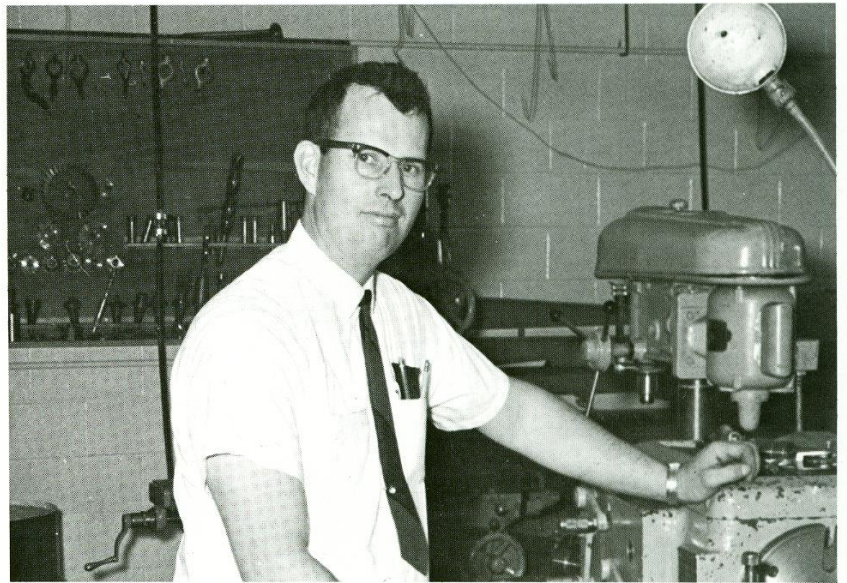


Industrial Arts Produces Usefulness Through Experience

In the Electricity, Metal, Mechanical Drawing, and Printing Shops, students experienced the satisfaction of working with their hands to produce articles of usefulness and value.

In Printing Shop, boys experimented with various forms of type such as hand-set, and off-set; they also practiced book-binding, elementary photography, rubber stamp making and silk screen work. In Electricity radios were the main focus of attention. Boys, throughout the course of the entire year, produced their own radios from the bare materials. In Mechanical Drawing, students copied drawings from books to achieve as much accuracy as possible.

Further work with metals, electricity and woodwork rounded off the year in this department.



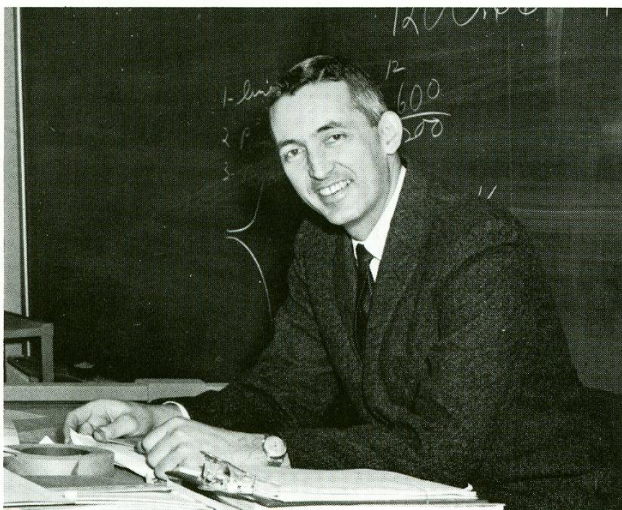

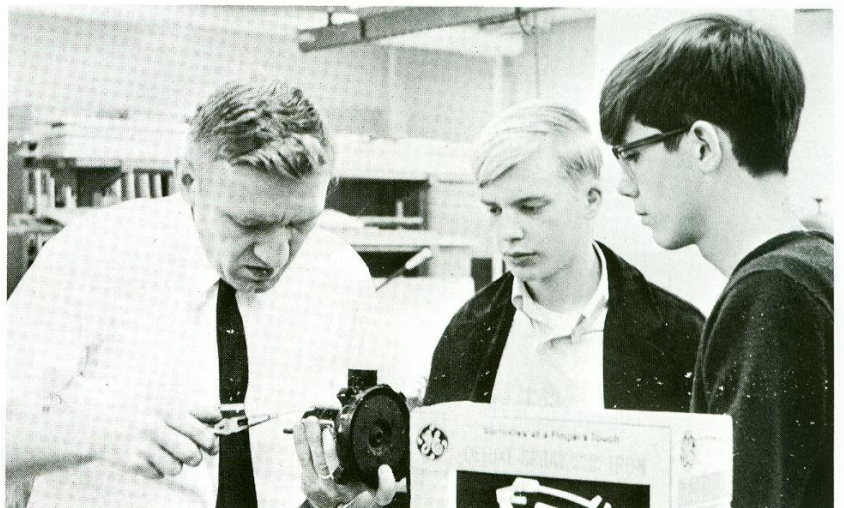
